

Period 1 1:00 - 2:15

1. Using DNA in Genealogy

Kim Smith, Presenter. We'll look at a few resources available to help interpret your DNA results, along with some tips and techniques. We'll also review some, of the constantly changing, available tools along with AncestryDNA new offerings.

2. Using Land Records in Genealogy.

Dave Decker, Presenter. In the past I had given a talk for WGS about using land records in genealogical research. Focusing on Oakland County, I use examples from my own genealogy to demonstrate how land records can work between census years to give you good evidence for an ancestor's arrival and family connections through land transactions, and other helpful information.

3. Beginning Irish Genealogy

Cathy Cottone, Presenter. In order to find information on your Irish ancestors, you will need to do as much research as you can here in the United States first. So you need to follow their paper trail to help give clues as to where they were from in Ireland. Events, like births, baptisms, marriages, naturalizations and deaths are a part of that paper trail. This program will help show you different resources and examples of that paper trail and then we will talk about different Irish websites that will help you once you are researching over the pond.

I have been following the "paper trail" of my ancestors since 1991 – I hope that my experiences will help you find that "golden nugget" that help you in your research!

4. Organizing your Data

Barbara Frye & Barbara Hofmann, Presenters. An overview of different ways to organize and store digital data & records on your computer. Some tips on organizing paper records as well.

Kris Rzepczynski Presenter. This session will explore the available U.S. passenger lists and indexes, the genealogical information typically found in them, and strategies for finding arrival records of your immigrant ancestors.
